#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TRAFFIC OPERATIONS**

The Executive Director Traffic Operations will report to the Assistant Commissioner of Police Traffic (ACP Traffic). The incumbent will provide oversight to traffic policing operations and is responsible to provide guidance, coaching, training, and other interventions to improve the functioning of the Traffic Operations Directorate (TOD) within the Royal Papua New Guinea Constabulary (RPNGC), principally through support to the Director TOD.

#### **Expected Competencies:**

- Bachelor's degree in a relevant field such as Traffic Engineering, Transportation Management, Civil Engineering, or a related discipline. A master's degree in a related field will be an advantage
- A Minimum of 10 years of progressively responsible experience in traffic management, with at least five years of experience in a leadership or managerial role dealing with traffic-related issues, policies, regulations, and enforcement strategies
- Ability to develop and implement traffic management strategies and policies
- Ability to coordinate and collaborate with other stakeholders, such as law enforcement agencies, local government bodies, and transportation authorities
- The ability to work independently, exercise sound judgment, and maintain composure in high-pressure situations
- Knowledge of legislation and other governance relevant to Traffic policing and the ability to readily translate these to the PNG environment, such as the Police Act 1998, Evidence Act 1975, Search Act 1974, Criminal Code Act 1974, Proceeds of Crime Act, Local Court Act, District Court Act, Lawyers Act or other related legislation.
