PUBLIC NOTICE

Consist with the SOE Controllers Notice dated 23rd September, 2020, the Papua New Guinea Immigration and Citizenship Authority (ICA) implemented the 'Short-Term 'Extension' process to Extend visas that were outside of the normal process for non-citizens who were affected by the closure of international borders due the COVID-19 Global Pandemic. The visa classes included:

✓ Tourist – Tour Package	Sixty (60) days
✓ Tourist – Own Itinerary	Sixty (60) days
✓ Visiting relatives	Sixty (60) days
✓ Easy Visitor Permit (EVP)	Thirty (30) days
✓ Easy Visitor Permit (EVP)	Sixty (60) days
✓ Yachtsperson Owner	Sixty (60) days
✓ Yachtsperson Crew	Sixty (60) days
✓ Business Single entry	Thirty (30) days
✓ Restricted Employment Visa (REV)	Thirty (30) days
✓ Journalists and Reporters	Thirty (30) days

In the same Notice, non-citizens who were temporary residents or on short-term visas and did not meet the Change of Status (COS) requirements were exempted from exiting the country to apply for a new visa, but allowed to do COS in the country for the following visa types:

- ✓ Visitor to Department
- ✓ Visitor to Department of Citizen
- ✓ Restricted Employment Visa to Employment
- ✓ Consultant/Specialist Visa to Employment
- ✓ Dependent to Employment.
- ✓ Business to Employment

Now, with the opening of all International Borders, ICA wishes to inform the General Public that this Arrangement will cease to operate effectively from **01st September 2022**. All non-citizens currently in the country on short term visas must prepare to leave the country on or before their visas expire. Penalties will apply for breach of this instruction.
